



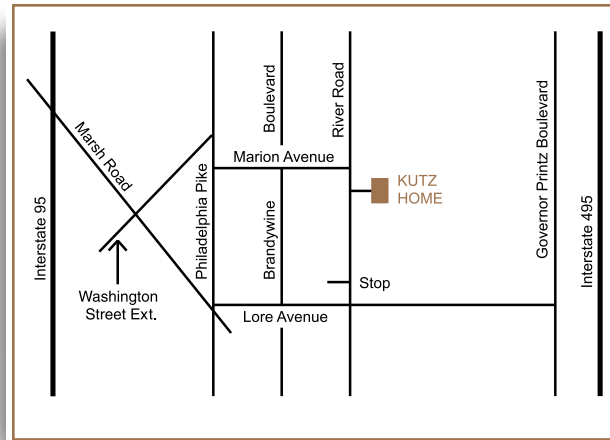

*The Kutz Home traces its roots to 1902, when members of the Ladies Bichor Cholem Society began visiting Wilmington's sick and elderly. Through great perseverance, the Society acquired a home in downtown Wilmington in 1920, and moved to larger quarters in 1942. When additional space was needed, our current Home was built in 1960 through the generosity of Milton and Hattie Kutz and other members of the community. In 1997, the Home was renovated and expanded to include its present 90 beds, an activities mall, a visitors' center, and two new wings. We continue to upgrade the facility in order to meet the changing needs of our residents.*

- Take I-95 North or South to the Marsh Road exit.
- From I-95 North, turn left at the end of the exit ramp; at the light, turn right onto Marsh Road.
- From I-95 South, turn left at the light onto Marsh Road.
- Follow Marsh Road to the first traffic light and turn left onto Washington Street Extension.
- At the first traffic light, turn right onto Philadelphia Pike and then turn left immediately onto Marion Avenue.
- At the bottom of the hill, turn right onto River Road and then turn left immediately into the Kutz Home parking lot.

## *The Whole Individual*



At the Kutz Home, growing older is recognized as a special time of life. Our trained staff cares for all the needs of our residents—medical, emotional, social, and spiritual.

These needs are met with

sensitivity and compassion, in an environment nurturing Jewish tradition and values. Our residents receive the highest quality of skilled care and rehabilitative services while maintaining a sense of personal continuity with family, friends, and community.



## *Professional Care*

It takes a special kind of person to care for the needs of older people. We have retained a highly skilled staff of compassionate and dedicated individuals, many of whom have been with us for 10, 20, and even 35 years. All of our registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, and certified nursing assistants have professional training and are experienced in geriatric care. Our excellent staff is our most valuable asset.

## *Rehabilitative Services*



The Kutz Home is Medicare-certified as a rehabilitation center providing on-site physical, occupational, and speech therapies to its residents. These therapies are also offered to individuals who require them on a short-term basis before returning to their own homes.

## *Comfort and Security*

We consider the Kutz Home, designed for comfort and security, to be the residents' home. Both private and semi-private rooms are bright, comfortable, and attractively furnished. Most rooms have private bathrooms, and there is a nurse-call system in every room.



The Home features several lounges and a large visitors' center.

Since we are situated on 11 acres in a suburban setting, there are patios and gardens where residents and their families can relax. We also have a "Wanderguard" system for the protection of our residents.



## *Lifestyle*

We provide a wide range of activities for our residents. Our activities mall includes a living area with a kitchen, where residents gather for refreshments and conversation; a crafts room; and a beauty/barber shop. Our activities staff coordinates a busy schedule of discussions, parties, family nights, fashion shows, Bingo, and musical and craft programs. Our wheelchair-accessible van allows residents to participate in community activities such as luncheons, cultural events, and shopping trips.

Whether they seek solitude or companionship, we help our residents find the lifestyle that makes them happiest.



## *Jewish Tradition*

Jewish values and tradition are very important aspects of life at the Kutz Home. Services are conducted on Friday evenings, Saturdays, and holidays in our synagogue. Residents can light candles for Shabbat and *yahrzeit* in our candle room. All meals at the Kutz Home are kosher, in addition to being delicious and plentiful. The Home welcomes clergy of all religions, and all residents feel comfortable observing their individual faiths.
